That is why the CBI focuses on strengthening and updating bilateral institutions.

WHERE WE COME FROM

In January 2020, twelve former Mexican and American ambassadors and experts came together in an event called *The Convocation* to assess the current state of the U.S.-Mexico bilateral relationship. Their central recommendation was the need to improve and update some of the main existing dialogue and cooperation mechanisms.

The CBI is an initiative by the <u>U.S.-Mexico Foundation</u>, a binational nonprofit organization dedicated to fostering bilateral cooperation and understanding between the United States and Mexico.
